## **“Update on Long-Acting Reversible Contraception (LARC)”** (Course No. MMC15087)

Join us for a training to learn about best practices for provision of intrauterine devices (IUDs) and contraceptive implants! Licensed staff receive up to 4.5 CME/CE credit hours at no cost.

**Morning Session (8:00 am – 1:00 pm):** This training is designed for clinicians, health educators, managers, billing specialists, and administrative staff. The first session, for all clinic staff, will include information on medical eligibility for IUDs and implants, common misunderstandings about these methods, and billing and clinic flow troubleshooting. Concurrent sessions will be conducted for health educators and clinicians. The session for health educators provides opportunities to build counseling skills and role play client counseling scenarios specific to LARC method use. The clinician practicum provides hands-on insertion practice with small uterine models and clinical tips and tricks for insertion and removal.

**Afternoon Session (1:30 pm – 4:30 pm):** Pending approval from Merck, we expect to offer a NEXPLANON training for licensed clinicians. Please let us know if you are interested.
