Dear Pediatric Colleagues:

As we start a new school year, I am grateful to each of you for your tireless work to ensure our students receive their well-child visits and have all of their required pediatric immunizations. One of the most important aspects of keeping students safe and healthy in school is through immunizations. With your help, the District has made a concerted and coordinated effort across our city to ensure families have access to vaccinations and know about our immunization enforcement policy, as required by District law, for all students in DC schools.

As you may have heard, last month the Deputy Mayor for Education released updated guidance regarding the enforcement timeline of the Immunization Attendance Policy for routine pediatric immunizations and the COVID-19 vaccine during the 2022-23 school year. To reduce the number of students who could be excluded from school at any one time, and to align schools and local education agencies (LEAs) to one unified notification and exclusion timeline, schools in the District are encouraged to implement staggered enforcement based on grade band. Required immunizations include all routine pediatric immunizations for all students and, for all students 12 and older, the COVID-19 vaccine.
