

Risk Factors for Targeted TB Screening per CDC Recommendations

- Recent or prolonged contact with someone with infectious TB disease
- Foreign-born person from or recent traveler to high-prevalence area
- CXR with fibrotic changes suggestive of inactive or past TB
- HIV infection
- Organ transplant recipient
- Immunosuppression secondary to use of prednisone (equivalent of $\geq 15\text{mg/day}$ for ≥ 1 month) or other immunosuppressive medication such as TNF- α antagonists
- IV drug use
- Resident or employee of high-risk congregate setting (eg. Prison, longterm care facility, hospital, homeless shelter)
- Medical condition associated with risk of progressing to TB disease if infected (eg. DM, cancer, ESRD, chronic malabsorption syndrome, severe malnutrition, etc).
- Signs and symptoms of TB
